- Scroll down to "Register for Symposium Presentation"
- Select type of presentation
- Select Student Awards if you are a student
- If you are a Faculty Member or Researcher (**not a student**), select if you would like to be a Judge
- Type in Address
- Select "Add to Cart"
- A new window will pop up requesting payment for registration; you can use your PayPal Account or a Credit Card
- Once payment is complete, scroll to bottom of page and select "Return to Merchant"
- Upload Abstract as directed
  - Type in Presenter name(s)
  - Type in one contact email address
  - If there is a specific message for Symposium organizers, type in Message box
  - Select "Choose File" and upload your Abstract (see guidelines below for Abstract format)
- Click "Submit"
- You should receive an email within 24 hours confirming your abstract submission

## Abstract Guidelines for Papers and Posters

Please limit abstracts to no more than 250 words. Abstract must include:

- Title
- List of all authors and their affiliations; indicate which author(s) is/are presenting with an (\*)
- Abstracts must be submitted in MSWord
- All text should be in 12 pt. Times New Roman font and single spaced

#### Oral Presentations

- Presentation should be a total of 20 minutes in length, which includes time for questions
- All oral presentations will be given in Room 112 of the Tom Ridge Environmental Center and virtually
- All talks should be loaded on the computer at the registration table no later than the break prior to the session of the presentation; Talks can be loaded at an earlier date by coordinating with the RSC Executive Director, Jeanette Schnars
- A USB drive is an acceptable means for transferring talks to the desktop.
- You WILL NOT be able to connect your individual laptop computer to the projector in the room
- All presentations must run using MS PowerPoint
- The laptop and projection system are PC compatible; Please verify your stored presentation will transfer and run on an independent computer before coming to the conference
- We will make all attempts to make the audiovisual support as seamless as possible; We will not, however, delay the program because of failure of a presentation to run on the host computer

#### Poster Presentations & Art Exhibits

- Presenters and Artists must be available during the Poster Session & Art Exhibit on Wednesday, November 6 (6:00 – 8:30 PM) to qualify for judging for the student awards
- Posters must measure no greater than **38 inches wide**
- Each presenter will need to supply their own Velcro to hang their poster
- Hanging posters using pins or tacks does not work
- Posters should be taken down at the end of the Poster Session
- Art Exhibits
  - Please advise Symposium organizers the dimensions and type of support needed to display your artwork (table, panels, floor space with stanchions, electric available, etc.)
  - All forms of art are welcome



# <u>Speed Talks</u>

• We encourage those students and researchers with new projects to present. If your project is a proposal or only has a limited amount of data, then present at the "Speed Talk" session. The Speed Talk sessions are only 10 minutes; however, this is a great opportunity to inform other researchers of your work and encourage collaborations and partnerships.

# The Jerry B. Covert Student Presentation Awards

- Undergraduate and graduate students giving oral, poster, or art presentations that want to be considered for *Student Presentations Awards* should note this on their registration form
- Oral presentations 1<sup>st</sup> Place \$100, 2<sup>nd</sup> Place \$50, poster presentation 1<sup>st</sup> Place \$50 (undergraduate and graduate students), art presentation 1<sup>st</sup> Place \$50 (undergraduate and graduate students)
- Awards will be presented Friday, November 8 (see Proceeding for time);
- Presentations that are part of the "Speed Talk" session are not eligible for student awards

### <u>Judges</u>

• If you are a faculty member or researcher, please consider judging the student presentations. Sign up by submitting the registration form online. Judging packets will be available at the registration table during the Symposium.
